Spring Raptor Migration Summary 2005

Five watchsites reported counts for spring 2005 (Tables 1 and 2). A total of 7,570 raptors representing 17 species was reported. The passage rate for all species for five sites ranged from 3.92 to 6.35 raptors per hour (average 6.0). Count effort (hours of observation) for the five watchsites totaled 1456 hours, ranging from 124 to 399 hours among sites. Comparing data among watchsites is difficult because of differences in count effort. Allegheny Front and Tussey Mountain counted for a week in February and throughout all of March, whereas Rose Tree Park and Tuscarora Summit counted only during late March, and Hawk Mountain counted only one day that month. All of the sites had good coverage in April, but only Allegheny Front and Hawk Mountain extended the counts into May.

Composition of the flight

Red-tailed Hawks (Buteo jamaicensis) made up 23% of the overall flight (range 13-28%), and their migration peaked in late March - early April. Red-tailed Hawk numbers were followed closely by Broad-winged Hawks (Buteo platypterus), which appeared at watchsites beginning in early April, peaking in the second half of the month. and making up 21% of the overall flight (range of 12-33%). Broadwings were the most common species at Hawk Mountain and Rose Tree Park, whereas Red-tails were the most abundant species at Allegheny Front and Tussey Mountain, and Turkey Vultures (Cathartes aura) were the most common species counted at Tuscarora Summit (47%).

Turkey Vultures were the third most abundant species overall, making up 19% of the total count (range of 1-47%). Vultures were seen as early as February, with most individuals passing in March (Table 2). Sharp-shinned Hawks (Accipiter striatus), whose migration peaked in March and April. were the only other species that made-up close to 10% of the overall flight (9%).

At all sites, Ospreys (Pandion haliaetus) were first seen in late March, with the earliest sighting at Rose Tree Park on March 21. Osprey numbers peaked in the middle of April. For watchsites that also conduct autumn counts (i.e., all except Tussev Mountain). Osprevs and Northern Harriers (Circus cyaneus) are relatively more common in spring than they are in autumn, whereas Sharp-shinned Hawks are relatively less common in spring.

Nine of twelve Peregrine Falcons (Falco peregrinus) were reported between April 5 and 29 and seventeen of the thirty Merlins (F. columbarius) were seen in late March. More than 60% of American Kestrels (F. sparverius) were counted in April. Golden Eagles (Aquila chrysactos) were the earliest migrants to arrive in spring; 5% of all Golden Eagles counted were detected in February, with Allegheny Front and Tussey Mountain accounting for all of these observations.

Seasonal Highlights

Allegheny Front (Bedford County) - The most common migrants this spring were Red-tailed Hawks (620). Broadwinged Hawks (442), Turkey Vultures (427), and Sharp-shinned Hawks (213). March 30th was the day to be at Allegheny this spring, when 10% of the overall flight passed (205 birds), Season highs on the 30th included Sharp-shinned Hawks (38), Cooper's Hawks (Accipiter cooperii) (24), Red-shouldered Hawks (Buteo lineatus; 11), and Merlins (3). Seventy percent of the Broadwing flight was observed between April 14 - 20th Season record counts included 620 Redtailed Hawks, 213 Sharp-shinned Hawks, 20 Black Vultures (Coragyps atratus), and 91 Cooper's Hawks. Allegheny had the highest overall count (among watchsites) for both Merlins (10) and Peregrine Falcons (8).

Hawk Mountain Sanctuary (Berks and Schuylkill Counties) - The peak of the spring flight was a 137-bird count (13% of the season's total) on April 24. Seventy-five percent of the birds counted on that day were Broadwings (104). Onehundred and thirty-four Ospreys were counted this season, 25% of which were detected on the 5th and 6th of May (23 and 10 birds, respectively). The peak period of migration during the official count (April 1 - May 15) was April 17 - 26, when nearly 75% of the season's Broadwinged Hawks passed, as did more than one-quarter of Ospreys and Northern

Harriers, and one-third of Bald Eagles and Sharp-shinned Hawks. Season records (since 1998) were set for Black Vultures (21) and Northern Goshawks (Accipiter gentiles; 3). One Mississippi Kite (Ictinia mississipiensis) was observed on April

Rose Tree Park

(Delaware County) - This spring resulted in the lowest total count and rate of passage (4.1 birds per hour versus average of 9.5 birds per hour) recorded in seven years, and brought below-average flights for Broadwings (270; 6 year average = 1435) and American Kestrels (82; 6 year average = 125), as well as Turkey Vultures (153) and Sharp-shinned Hawks (157). Almost one-third (24) of the American Kestrels were counted on April 6th, 55% of the Osprey flight occurred on March 30th, and 85% of the Broadwings were observed between April 17 and 21st. Other highlights for the season include record-breaking counts for Cooper's Hawks (80) and Bald Eagles (56), the highest of any other watchsite this season.

Tuscarora Summit (Fulton County) -March 26th was the biggest day, with a record-breaking 58 Red-tails, 10 Sharpshins, and 156 Turkey Vultures. In fact, over 50% of the total flight for Turkey Vultures was observed on that day. This was the only site at which Turkey Vultures (226) made up more than 45% of the overall flight, Red-tails (104) were the second most common migrant, comprising 21% of the total flight composition. Only 61 Broadwings were counted this spring, and 60% of them passed through on the 18th and 19th of April. One Golden Eagle was spotted on April 21.

Tussey Mountain (Centre County) -Red-tailed Hawks (664), Turkey Vultures (607), and Broad-winged Hawks (462) were predominant at Tussey Mountain this spring. The peak period of migration for several species was March 29 – 31, including season high counts on March 30th of 149 Turkey Vultures, 89 Red-tailed Hawks, and 13 American Kestrels, and season high counts on the 31st for Sharp-shinned Hawks (38) and Cooper's Hawks (16), Tussey Mountain also had the highest count of Red-shouldered Hawks (82), 90% of which were counted in March. Peak flights of Golden Eagles occurred in mid-March (March 12 - 19), with an average of 11 eagles per day and a total of 178 for the season.


